## **Show and Tell**

John 1:35-49 04/02/23

<u>John 1:35–37</u> (NLT) <sup>35</sup> The following day John was again standing with two of his disciples. <sup>36</sup> As Jesus walked by, John looked at him and declared, "Look! There is the Lamb of God!" <sup>37</sup> When John's two disciples heard this, they followed Jesus.

## 1. Jesus invites you to come and see Him.

John 1:39, 43-44 (NLT) <sup>39</sup> "Come and see," he said. It was about four o'clock in the afternoon when they went with him to the place where he was staying, and they remained with him the rest of the day. <sup>43</sup> The next day Jesus decided to go to Galilee. He found Philip and said to him, "Come, follow me." <sup>44</sup> Philip was from Bethsaida, Andrew and Peter's hometown.

<u>John 1:48</u> (ESV) <sup>48</sup> Nathanael said to him, "How do you know me?" Jesus answered him, "Before Philip called you, when you were under the fig tree, I saw you."

<u>John 6:37</u> (ESV) <sup>37</sup> All that the Father gives me will come to me, and whoever comes to me I will never cast out.

## 2. Jesus invites you to invite others to him.

<u>John 1:45–46</u> (NLT) <sup>45</sup> Philip went to look for Nathanael and told him, "We have found the very person Moses and the prophets wrote about! His name is Jesus, the son of Joseph from Nazareth." <sup>46</sup> "Nazareth!" exclaimed Nathanael. "Can anything good come from Nazareth?" "Come and see for yourself," Philip replied.

<u>Luke 6:40</u> (ESV) <sup>40</sup> A disciple is not above his teacher, but everyone when he is fully trained will be like his teacher.
